

## GOT PAINT?

Latex paints are water-based and can be dried out with different materials. Oil-based paints should not be dried out and need to be disposed of properly - not in your curbside trash.

## LATEX PAINTS

- 1. Confirm the paint is latex or water-based and not oil-based.
- 2. Gather a trash bag and cardboard box for disposal afterwards.
- 3. Use cat litter, shredded newspaper, sawdust, mulch, or any similar material that will absorb the paint.
- 4. Mix directly in the paint can or pour into trash bag lined in cardboard box. Leave the lid off.
- 5. Let dry and solidify for a few hours. Add more drying material if you need.
- 6. Once completely dry, leave the lid off and dispose in curbside trash.

## OIL-BASED PAINTS

- 1.Oil-based paint is considered a hazardous item and must be properly disposed of due to the chemicals within them.
