CAMPBELL COUNTY POLICE UTILIZES VOLUNTEERS TO ENHANCE OUR SERVICE LEVELS TO THE COMMUNITY AND THEY ARE A SIGNIFICANT CONTRIBUTOR TO PUBLIC SAFETY. IN 2010 VOLUNTEERS CONTRIBUTED OVER 1,106 HOURS TO THE CAMPBELL COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT. IN ADDITION TO SERVING OUR CITIZENS, OUR VOLUNTEERS ALSO ASSIST POLICE OFFICERS, AND THEIR EFFORTS RESULTED IN A MUCH MORE EFFECTIVE PATROL DIVISION AND INVESTIGATIVE SECTION.

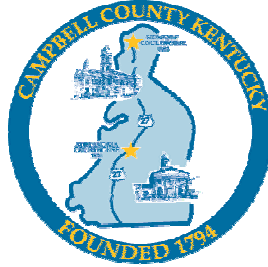

CAMPBELL COUNTY UTILIZES ENHANCED 911 SERVICE TO ENSURE EFFICIENT AND PROFESSIONAL RESPONSES TO POLICE EMERGENCIES THROUGHOUT THE COUNTY. CAMPBELL COUNTY POLICE PRESENT A CITIZEN POLICE ACADEMY EACH YEAR FOR THE RESIDENTS OF CAMPBELL COUNTY.

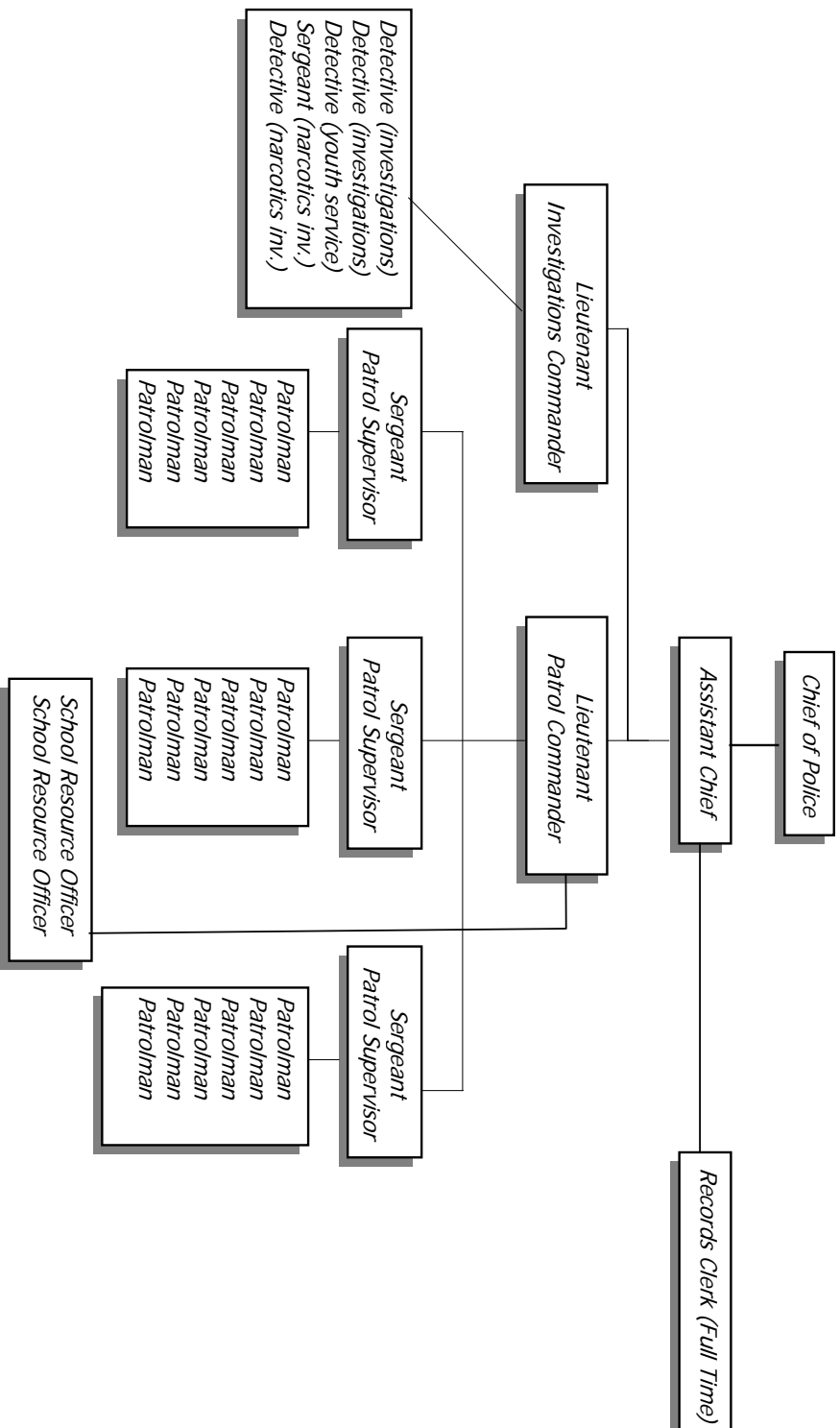
MISSION STATEMENT

PERSONNEL

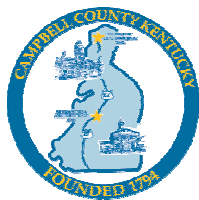

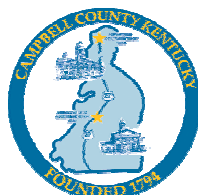

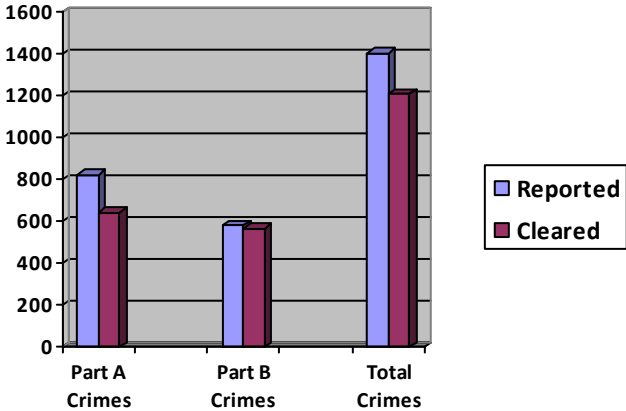
REPORTED CRIMES AND ACTIVITY

REPORTED CRIMES

CAMPBELL COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT CURRENTLY SUBMITS ITS UNIFORM CRIME REPORTS DIRECTLY TO THE FBI VIA THE NATIONAL INCIDENT-BASED REPORTING SYSTEM (NIBRS). THE CRIMES REPORTED ARE BROKEN DOWN INTO TWO TYPES, GROUP "A" AND GROUP "B". THE CRIMES ARE GROUPED BY HOW SIGNIFICANT THE CRIME IS, HOW WIDESPREAD THE CRIME OCCURS, AND THE VOLUME OF THE CRIME THROUGHOUT THE UNITED STATES.

GROUP "A" OFFENSES ARE THE MORE SERIOUS OF THE GROUPS. CAMPBELL COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT CURRENTLY HAS A TOTAL CLEARANCE RATE OF 86% OF ALL CRIMES REPORTED. BROKEN DOWN THIS RESULTS IN A 78% CLEARANCE RATE FOR GROUP "A" CRIMES AND A 97% CLEARANCE RATE FOR GROUP "B" CRIMES.

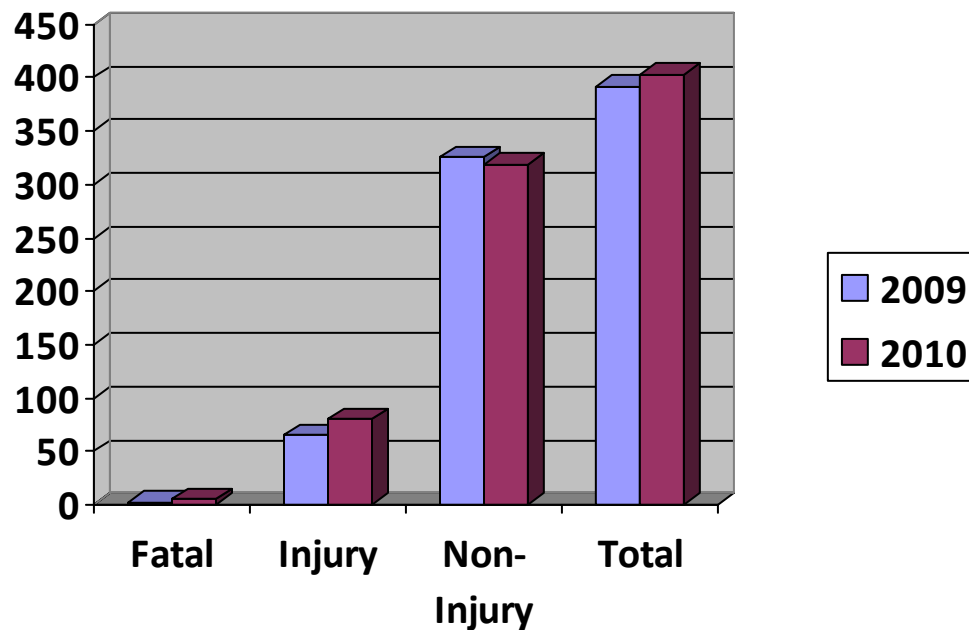
IN 2010, CAMPBELL COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT HAD 51,223 CALLS FOR SERVICE THAT WERE EITHER DISPATCHED TO THE OFFICERS, OR WERE THE RESULTS OF THEIR ACTIVITY. THIS IS AN 8.8% INCREASE IN ACTIVITY FROM THE 2009 TOTAL OF 47,064 RECORDED CALLS FOR SERVICE. A CALL FOR SERVICE IS A RECORDED ACTIVITY THAT OFFICERS PERFORM DURING THEIR SHIFT. AN OFFICER MAKING A TRAFFIC STOP, CHECKING A RESIDENCE FOR A VACATION CHECK REQUEST, OR BEING DISPATCHED TO A CRIME IN PROGRESS ARE ALL EXAMPLES OF A RECORDED CALL FOR SERVICE

TRAFFIC AND ACCIDENT INVESTIGATION

IN 2010 THE CAMPBELL COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT SAW AN INCREASE IN ACCIDENTS BY 2.8% FROM 2009. THERE WAS AN INCREASE OF 23% IN INJURY ACCIDENTS, AND A 2.1% DECREASE IN NON-INJURY ACCIDENTS. OUR TOTAL OF 403 ACCIDENTS IN 2010 IS ELEVEN MORE THAN THE REPORTED 392 FROM 2009.

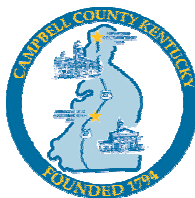

PERHAPS THE MOST GLARING CATEGORICAL INCREASE IN CITATIONS OTHER THAN "ALL OTHERS", OFFICERS GENERATED 304% MORE CITATIONS FOR TRAFFIC CONTROL AND STOP SIGN VIOLATIONS. OTHER NOTABLE INCREASES ARE SEEN IN REGISTRATION PLATE VIOLATIONS, SUSPENDED LICENSE VIOLATIONS, RECKLESS DRIVING, SEATBELT AND CHILD RESTRAINT VIOLATIONS, AND INSURANCE VIOLATIONS.
