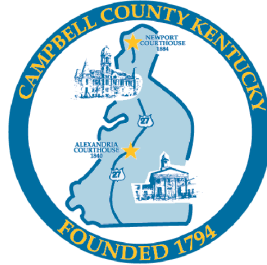

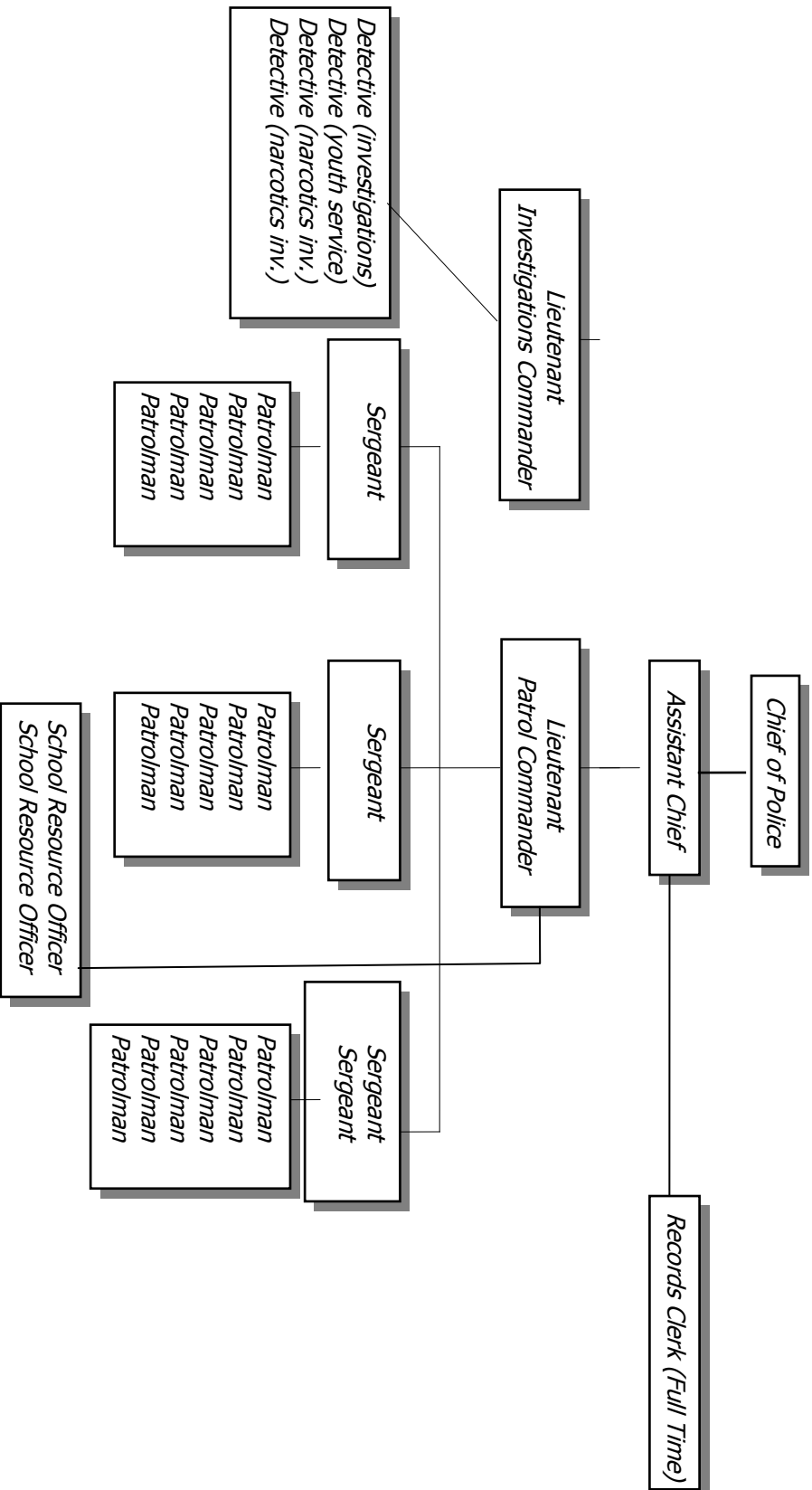
MISSION STATEMENT

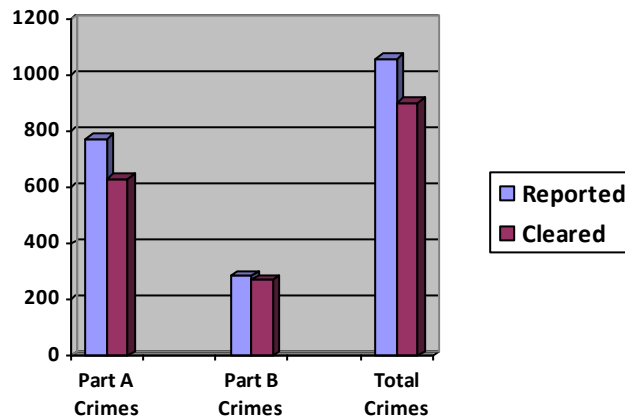
REPORTED CRIMES AND ACTIVITY

REPORTED CRIMES

CAMPBELL COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT CURRENTLY SUBMITS ITS UNIFORM CRIME REPORTS DIRECTLY TO THE FBI VIA THE NATIONAL INCIDENT-BASED REPORTING SYSTEM (NIBRS). THE CRIMES REPORTED ARE BROKEN DOWN INTO TWO TYPES, GROUP "A" AND GROUP "B". THE CRIMES ARE GROUPED BY HOW SIGNIFICANT THE CRIME IS, HOW WIDESPREAD THE CRIME OCCURS, AND THE VOLUME OF THE CRIME THROUGHOUT THE UNITED STATES.

GROUP "A" OFFENSES ARE THE MORE SERIOUS OF THE GROUPS. CAMPBELL COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT CURRENTLY HAS A TOTAL CLEARANCE RATE OF 85% OF ALL CRIMES REPORTED. BROKEN DOWN THIS RESULTS IN A 82% CLEARANCE RATE FOR GROUP "A" CRIMES AND A 95% CLEARANCE RATE FOR GROUP "B" CRIMES.

IN 2012, CAMPBELL COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT HAD 41,145 CALLS FOR SERVICE THAT WERE EITHER DISPATCHED TO THE OFFICERS, OR WERE THE RESULTS OF THEIR ACTIVITY. A CALL FOR SERVICE IS A RECORDED ACTIVITY THAT OFFICERS PERFORM DURING THEIR SHIFT. AN OFFICER MAKING A TRAFFIC STOP, CHECKING A RESIDENCE FOR A VACATION CHECK REQUEST, OR BEING DISPATCHED TO A CRIME IN PROGRESS ARE ALL EXAMPLES OF A RECORDED CALL FOR SERVICE.

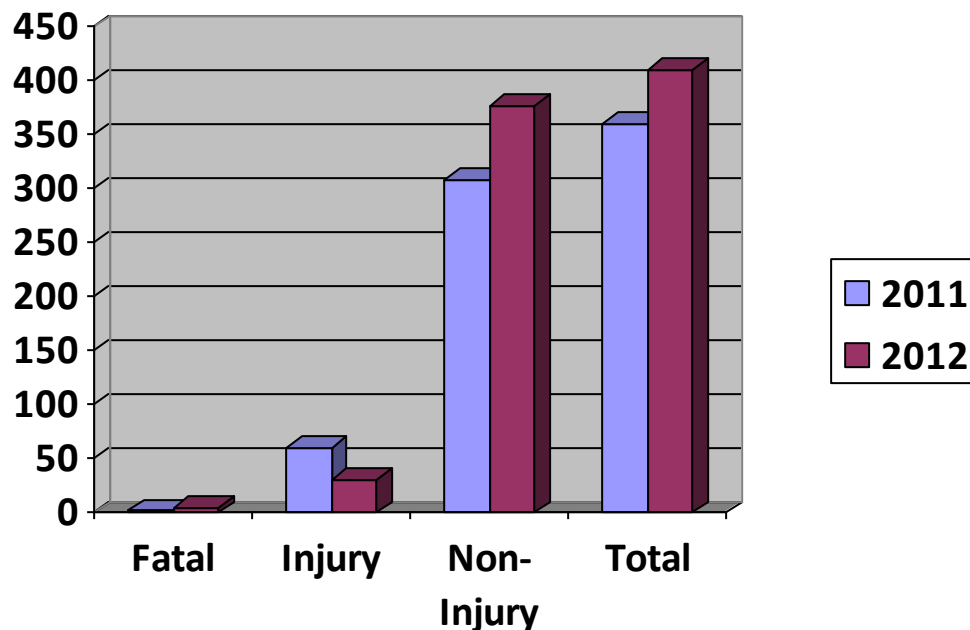

TRAFFIC AND ACCIDENT INVESTIGATION

IN 2012 THE CAMPBELL COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT SAW AN INCREASE IN ACCIDENTS BY 10.8% FROM 2011.

THERE WAS AN INCREASE OF 100% IN FATALITIES, A 50% DECREASE IN INJURY ACCIDENTS, AND A 10.8% INCREASE IN NON-INJURY ACCIDENTS. OUR TOTAL OF 410 ACCIDENTS IN 2012 IS 4% MORE THAN THE REPORTED 370 FROM 2011.

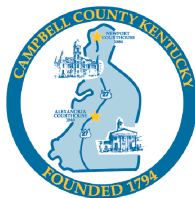
