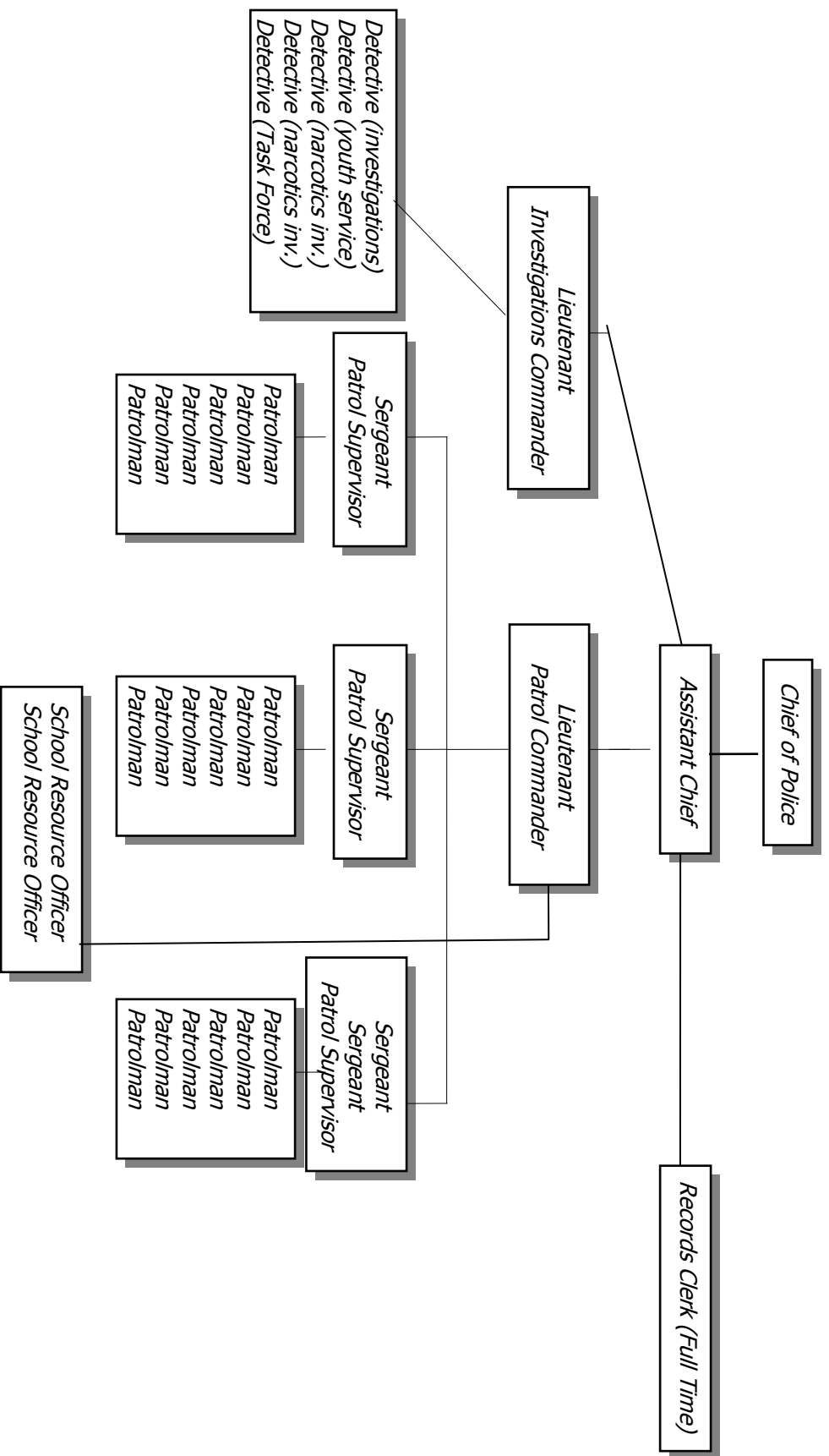
## MISSION STATEMENT

# PERSONNEL

THE CAMPBELL COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT CURRENTLY HAS A STAFF OF THIRTY-ONE SWORN POLICE OFFICERS AND ONE RECORDS CLERK. OFFICERS OF THE DEPARTMENT ARE DIVIDED AMONG RESPONSIBILITIES OF PATROL, INVESTIGATIONS, SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS, AND DRUG INVESTIGATION OFFICERS.

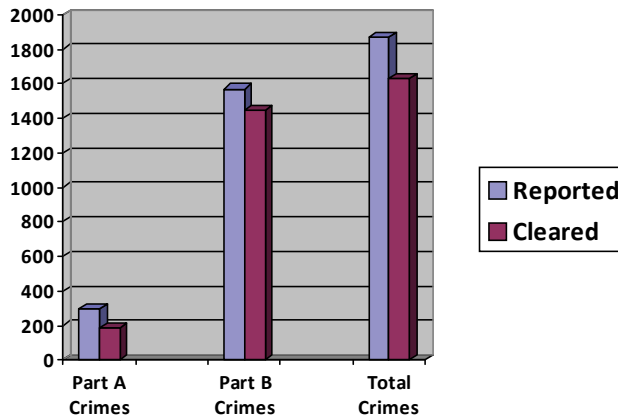
# REPORTED CRIMES AND ACTIVITY

## REPORTED CRIMES

CAMPBELL COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT CURRENTLY SUBMITS ITS UNIFORM CRIME REPORTS DIRECTLY TO THE FBI VIA THE NATIONAL INCIDENT-BASED REPORTING SYSTEM (NIBRS). THE CRIMES REPORTED ARE BROKEN DOWN INTO TWO TYPES, GROUP "A" AND GROUP "B". THE CRIMES ARE GROUPED BY HOW SIGNIFICANT THE CRIME IS, HOW WIDESPREAD THE CRIME OCCURS, AND THE VOLUME OF THE CRIME THROUGHOUT THE UNITED STATES.

GROUP "A" OFFENSES ARE THE MORE SERIOUS OF THE GROUPS. CAMPBELL COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT CURRENTLY HAS A TOTAL CLEARANCE RATE OF 87% OF ALL CRIMES REPORTED. BROKEN DOWN THIS RESULTS IN A 64% CLEARANCE RATE FOR GROUP "A" CRIMES AND A 92% CLEARANCE RATE FOR GROUP "B" CRIMES.

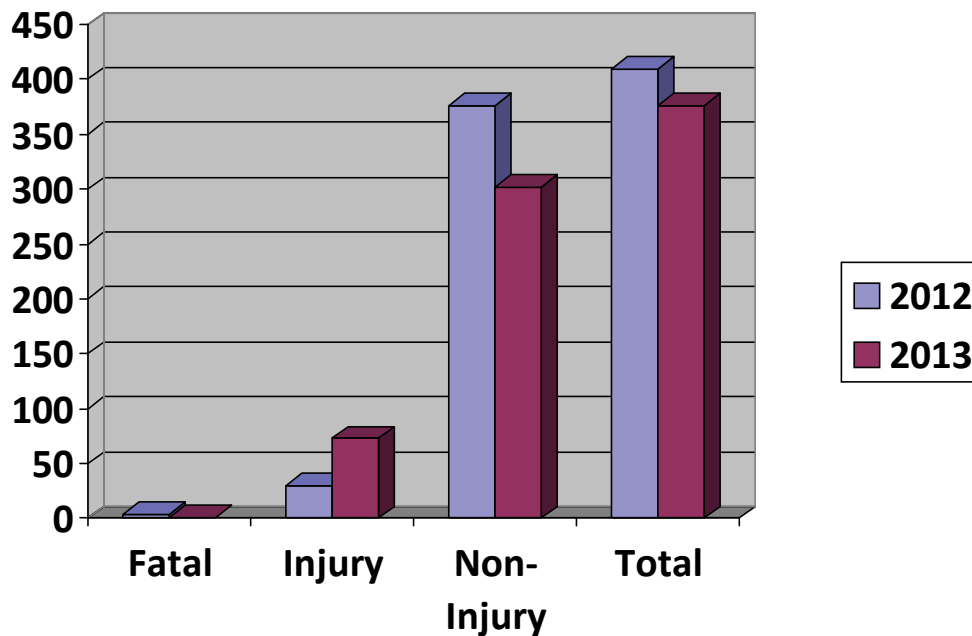
IN 2013, CAMPBELL COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT HAD 37,283 CALLS FOR SERVICE THAT WERE EITHER DISPATCHED TO THE OFFICERS, OR WERE THE RESULTS OF THEIR ACTIVITY. A CALL FOR SERVICE IS A RECORDED ACTIVITY THAT OFFICERS PERFORM DURING THEIR SHIFT. AN OFFICER MAKING A TRAFFIC STOP, CHECKING A RESIDENCE FOR A VACATION CHECK REQUEST, OR BEING DISPATCHED TO A CRIME IN PROGRESS ARE ALL EXAMPLES OF A RECORDED CALL FOR SERVICE.

# TRAFFIC AND ACCIDENT INVESTIGATION

IN 2013 THE CAMPBELL COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT SAW AN DECREASE IN ACCIDENTS BY 7% FROM 2012. THERE WAS AN DECREASE OF 66% IN FATALITIES, A 2% INCREASE IN INJURY ACCIDENTS, AND A 9.5% DECREASE IN NON-INJURY ACCIDENTS. OUR TOTAL OF 376 ACCIDENTS IN 2013 IS 7% LESS THAN THE REPORTED 408 FROM 2012.

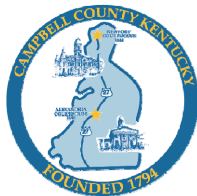

# 2013 GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Our Loyalty, Unity, and Courage will ensure these standards will never be compromised.
- 2) Institute new strategies to prevent, detect and control crime and traffic accidents
  - Data Driven Approaches to Crime and Traffic Study (DDACTS)
- 3) Expand information sharing, cooperation and communication
  - Utilize “Roll Call Message Section” on Kentucky Data Interoperability
- 4) Utilize Social Media to promote department, disseminate information, gather intelligence and solve crimes
  - Facebook
  - Twitter
- 5) Update the Campbell County Police Department Policy and Procedure Manual
  - Changes approved that bring the Manual up to date With current technology, current legislation and departmental changes.

  - Partner with Alexandria Police to begin a Volunteers in Police Service In School Program at Reiley Elementary and Grants Lick Elementary
  
- 8) Enforce traffic laws to keep the loss of life and property to a minimum
  - 3978 traffic citations
  - Reduced Fatality Accidents
  - Reduced the Total Number of Accidents
  
- 9) Focus on illegal drug problem by increasing street-level drug arrests
  - 239 citations
  - Directed enforcement in targeted areas
  - Officer assigned to the Campbell County Drug Task Force
  - Officers assigned to the Northern KY Drug Strike Force
  
- 10) Maintain index crime clearance rates at or above the national average, and routinely evaluate other clearance rates, as necessary, to proactively respond to community needs
  - 87% clearance rate
