Course Description

G2300 Intermediate Emergency Operations Center Functions is a three-day course with the goal of assisting individuals and jurisdictions who desire to develop or improve their Emergency Operation Centers (EOC). By the end of the course, students will be able to demonstrate, through activities and a Final Exam, the managerial and operational roles of the modern-day EOC as a NIMS Command and Coordination functional group operating within a Multiagency Coordination System (MACS). The course begins promptly at 8:30 A.M. (Eastern) and concludes at 4:30 P.M. (Eastern) on each of the three days.

Student Criteria

This course is open to all federal, state, tribal, territorial, local level, business and nongovernmental emergency management personnel who may be designated to support an Emergency Operations Center (EOC) within their jurisdiction or organization. The audience may include students from a variety of agencies, organizations and functional disciplines, including fire service, law enforcement, emergency management, public works departments, as well as public health organizations, medical emergency teams and hospitals, businesses and non-governmental organizations.

Recommended Prerequisites: IS-100, IS-200, IS-700, IS-800 and IS-2200

Special Notes

A MINIMUM # of fifteen (15) advance student registrations is REQUIRED and must be received by **June 14**th, **2022.** A MAXIMUM# of thirty (30) students COVID-19 will be accepted. mitigation efforts such as social distancing, monitoring for symptoms, sanitizing and hand washing remain in effect regardless of vaccination status. No student will be permitted to attend class if they have signs or symptoms of COVID-19 or flu-like symptoms per CDC and State guidelines.
