Situation to date (what has happened)

- 52 people in Kentucky have tested (confirmed) positive for COVID – 19
- There were 26,500 social media shares for the KY COVID-19 website for March 20, 2020.
- All PPE from the states cache was dispensed as of March 20, 2020.

Actions to date (what has been done)

- The Healthcare Preparedness Program is asking for daily bed availability updates.
- Local health departments have activated their EOCs and continue to report in WebEOC and ReadyOp.
- Testing for COVID-19 completed at the Division of Laboratory Services (state lab), must be approved thru the Kentucky Department for Public Health (KDPH). KDPH determines if the patient fits the PUI case definition. Commercial laboratories are testing for COVID-19 and does not require KDPH approval; this may result in reporting lag times of cumulative numbers at the state level.
- All daycares in Kentucky are required to close today, March 20, 2020.

Activities to be completed (what will be done)

- Incident Command and Call Center training is scheduled for March 25, 2020.
- DPH and KYEM are working to finalize a framework to conduct drive-thru triage and/or testing capabilities.

Critical priorities (to be completed in the next 48 hours)

- Coordinating with KYEM to establish a unified command structure.
- KDPH has requested PPE cache through the Strategic National Stockpile.
- Exploring alternative options to obtain critical testing and PPE supplies.
