Situation for March 21,2020

- 99 people in Kentucky have tested (confirmed) positive for COVID – 19.
- There were 55,000 social media shares for the KY COVID-19 website on March 21, 2020.
- Developing a COVID – 19 screening form for drive-thru testing sites.
- Developing an isolation facility/low acuity plan.

Actions to date (what has been done to date)

- The Healthcare Preparedness Program is asking for daily bed availability updates.
- Local health departments have activated their EOCs and continue to report in WebEOC and ReadyOp.
- Testing for COVID-19 completed at the Division of Laboratory Services (state lab), must be approved thru the Kentucky Department for Public Health (KDPH). KDPH determines if the patient fits the PUI case definition. Commercial laboratories are testing for COVID-19 and does not require KDPH approval; this may result in reporting lag times of cumulative numbers at the state level.
- KDPH has requested PPE cache through the Strategic National Stockpile.

Activities to be completed (what will be done)

- Incident Command and Call Center training is scheduled for March 25, 2020.
- DPH and KYEM are working to finalize a framework to conduct drive-thru triage and/or testing capabilities.
- Follow up on medical staff contract in coordination with KYEM.

Critical priorities (to be completed in the next 48 hours)

- Coordinating with KYEM to establish a unified command structure.
- Exploring alternative options to obtain critical testing and PPE supplies.
- Continue to develop COVID – 19 screening form for drive-thru testing sites.
- Continue to develop an isolation facility/low acuity plan.
