CURRENT SITUATION

Governor Beshear declared a State of Emergency for the Commonwealth of Kentucky on March 6, 2020

Kentucky SEOC is at a Level 3 activation, staffed from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm

Kentucky has 163 (+39) confirmed cases: Please see [KDPH Dashboard](#) for specific county cases

Kentucky has 4 (no change) confirmed fatalities

Kentucky has 4 patients that have fully recovered

SEOC is focusing on planning and logistical efforts in support the DPH SHOC

KYEM Director weekly conference call with County Judge Executives and County Emergency Management Directors moved to Wednesday, March 25, 2020 and Friday, March 27, 2020 at 2:30 pm EDT this week only

Planning is complete for state supported drive thru testing. Sites have been identified for rural and urban areas. Working on shortfall for test kits, traffic control equipment, and staffing

SNS Reception and Distribution to Regional Public Health Districts

DPH has placed another order for SNS supply packages and planning for this to be a recurring event

The second shipment of the SNS arrived in Frankfort today. The SNS will be broken down in to county allocations and shipped to the public health regional distribution sites between March 26 and 27

KOHS has directed all personnel involved in SEOC operations to sign a NDA agreement to maintain OPSEC

DPH

Kentucky Department for Public Health's (KDPH) State Health Operations Center (SHOC) remains activated to Level 1 - Full Activation. SHOC personnel can be contacted via email at chfsdphdoc@ky.gov or by phone at 502-564-5460. After-hours, the On-Call Epidemiologist can be reached at 1-888-9REPORT

KDPH will continue to explore alternative options to obtain critical testing and PPE supplies, develop COVID-19 screening form for drive-thru testing sites, and an isolation facility/low acuity plan

FEMA has yet to provide specific guidance. Guidance will be distributed to all applicants as soon as received
